No unleached ashes shall be kept in wooden vessels nearer than 30 feet to the insured buildings, unless in brick or stone ash house. All fire or chimney boards shall be lined at the bottom with tin or other metals.

If a stove or stoves be used, pipes passing through floor or partition shall be secured with an earthen collar or metallic cylinder, or otherwise sufficiently secured; and if pipes pass into flue on upper story, shall be with an elbow, and the flue shall be built with brick, laid flat; or, when the clay chimneys are used, they must be securely arranged and the pipe not less than six inches in diameter in the clear. No pipe shall pass through the side wall or roof.

I inform the applicant that he will be bound by the application, and, if the risk be more hazardous than appears from his statement, the Company will not be liable in case of Loss.
