* One and plaster mill tile in fact Built of stone and wood covered with shingles. Main building 40 by 38 feet three stories and 1/2 one brick floor no fire place. Machinery for one run of plaster bars, disintegrator and lifting apparatus. Shed on west side 10 by 38. One story, has in it one Ridgeway crusher, pulley and shafting. One east side new frame horse house 50 by 38 two 1/2 stories no chimney or fire intended entirely for storage of stock. The stock consists of ground bones and plaster and will amount at times to about \$20,000 worth.

Buildings are insured in Mutual Fire Insurance Co. D.C. for \$4,000 and the stock in the Potomac Fire Insurance Co. of D.C. for \$1,000 This Mill is situated about 300 feet west of Aqueduct Bridge and 36 feet from Georgetown Corporation line between Ches. & Ohio Canal and Potomac River about 200 yds from any other building.
