If a stove or stoves be used, pipes passing through floor or partition shall be secured with an earthen collar or metallic cylinder, or otherwise sufficiently secured; and if pipes pass into flue on upper story, it shall be with an elbow, and flue shall be built with brick, laid flat. No pipe shall pass through side wall or roof. Ashes shall not be kept nearer than 25 yards to the insured buildings, unless in brick or stone ash house.
