Herewith I send you
the application for insurance on
your new cow house as requested
by Mr Bowin, you will notice that
I have made the rate 6 per cent -
our rate ^{on it} with the Blacksmith shop
where it is would have to be 9 per cent
but your nephew Calvin says you
propose fixing up the building near
Cow house for a stable and as
the shop in its present location
would increase the rate on all
buildings within thirty yards of it
and also their contents to 9 per cent instead
of 6 per cent he thought you would
remove the shop to some point

not less than 30 yards distant
from the other buildings

If this arrangement suits you
we can take it at the 6% it being
understood that until the shop
is removed the company will not
be expected to pay for any loss
arising from the use of the shop
in its present location

If this does not suit you you
can return the application & I will
make out another at 9% for the
Corn house & Grainery. but I think
to move the shop would be but
as you probably have ^{insurance} ~~a~~ ~~pest~~ on
grain transported from Bowie at
6 or 7% which would also not
be good within 30 yards of the
shop
