No ashes shall be kept in wooden vessels in or about the building insured. All fire or chimney boards shall be lined at the bottom with tin or other metal.
If a stove or stoves be used, pipes passing through floor or partition, shall be secured with an earthen collar or metallic cylinder, or otherwise sufficiently secured; and if pipes pass into flue on upper story, it shall be with an elbow, and flue shall be built with brick, laid flat. No pipe shall pass through side wall or roof.

Title to the property in fee simple and never can be... Dwelling of Frame & Log, a part weatherboarded, 28 feet by 20, with kitchen attached, 14 by 16, a part 2 story, the rest 1 1/2 stories high, with Chestnut and oak shingles, 3 chimneys and 3 stoves with pipes properly secured. Ashes kept in a stone cellar under the meat house. The building in a good state of repair, but not plastered throughout.

Barn 75 feet N. by 30 feet S. with carriage house attached 17 1/2 by 12, Stone slat by the 1st story of brick, and 2nd of frame, covered with oak shingles. Straw shed 44 feet by 10, the whole in a good state of repair. Coal house building 19 feet 6 inches from dwelling, stone and brick near house.
