

NEWS FROM BOYDS.

BOYDS, Md., Nov. 26.—Fire broke out at Cloppers, east of here, in the large barn of Frank Huton, and destroyed the property, with all the grain, corn, wheat, fodder and hay, and also destroyed a silo filled with green ensilage and a husker and shredder for husking and shredding corn, entailing a loss of \$3,500. The origin of the fire is unknown, unless it was set from the engine which was running the husker and shredder at the time. The fire broke out in the middle of the barn in the hay. This is the second time Mr. Hutton has lost his barn by fire. Two years ago he lost a barn by fire and a number of fine Jersey cows and some other stock.
