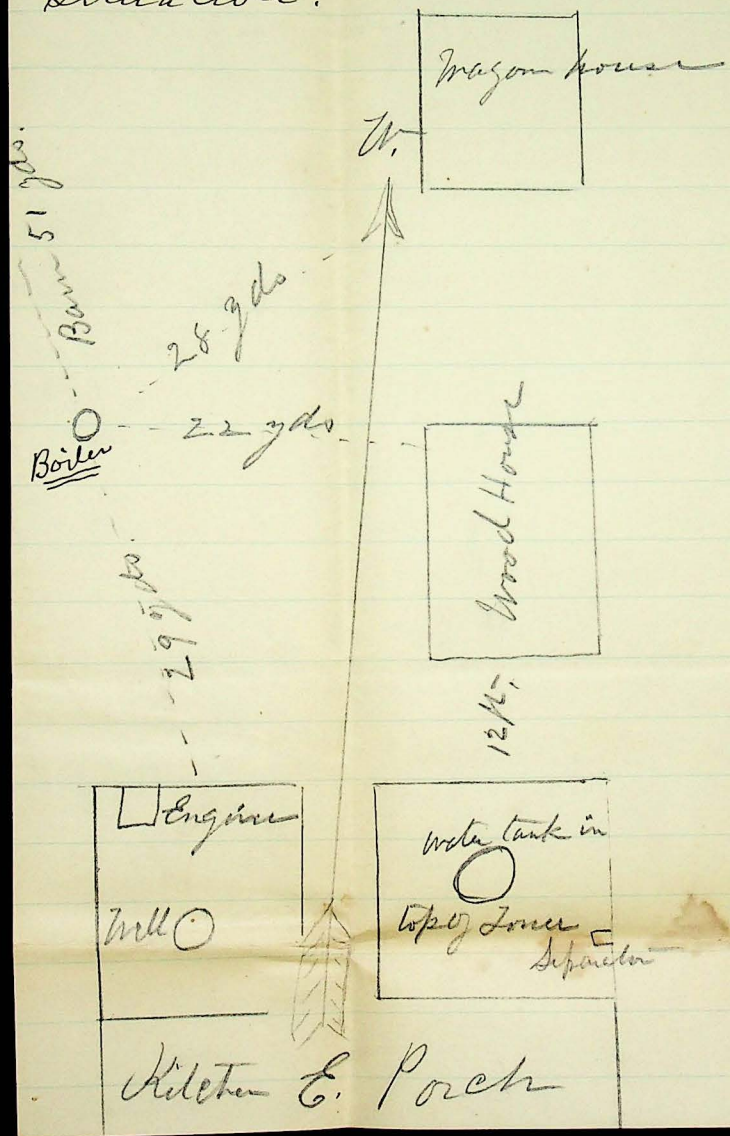
Dear Sir:

I am about to put up a small boiler & engine on my premises near insured property. I ask the approval of the "Company", and also wish to know if there will be any increased rate therefore. The enclosed diagram will show the position of the buildings insured with reference to said boiler. I think myself there will be no increased risk. There is now such an outfit at work, approved by one of our best agents, with boiler much nearer than mine will

be. I do not want the Co.
 to take an increased risk to oblige
 me at all, neither do I want
 to pay any additional insurance
 unless there is unquestionably
 an increased risk. I think the
 way my machinery will be
 placed there will be no more
 danger than is in 99 out of every
 hundred summer kitchens, in
 fact less danger. The boiler will
 be 22 yds. from any building,
 will have a spark arrestor, will
 burn coal except for getting up
 steam, the steam conveyed under
 ground to shed adjoining the
 well on kitchen porch, when
 the engine will work, to run a
 separator in tower & to pump
 water into tank above. This 1200
 gal. tank of water I consider

will more than counterbalance
all extra hazard.

Below is a diagram of the
situation:



My diagram show correct as to distances, but not exactly as to direction as my paper was too narrow; the boiler is really more decidedly S.W. of wood-house and not in front of it as here shown.
