 If a stove or stoves be used, pipes passing through floor or partition shall be secured with an earthen collar or metallic cylinder, or otherwise sufficiently secured; and if pipes pass into flue on upper story they shall be with an elbow, and the flue shall be built with brick, laid flat; or when fire clay chimneys are used, they must be securely arranged and the pipe not less than six inches in diameter in the clear. No pipe shall pass through the side wall or roof.
